

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# Yavapai County Ordinance No. 2013-1

## A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

### 1. PURPOSE

The intent of this ordinance is to establish a uniform County Road System including acquisition, construction and maintenance for all public roadways under the jurisdiction of the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors.

### 2. POLICY

No road fund labor, equipment or material shall be used on roads that have not been approved for maintenance. The County Road System will be listed on the official County Road Inventory, which will be maintained by the Public Works Director and shall be on file with all affected departments. No resources, including labor, equipment and material, other than for routine maintenance, will be used for engineering, surveying, right-of-way acquisition, road upgrade or other projects unless pre-approved by the Board of Supervisors as being part of an approved road project.

### 3. DEFINITIONS

- A. **ADTC:** Average Daily Traffic Counts.
- B. **APPROVED FOR MAINTENANCE:** Roadways which have been included in the road inventory as eligible for maintenance.
- C. **COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM:** Roads that have been included in the road inventory
- D. **ESTABLISHED COUNTY HIGHWAY/ROAD:** Establishment is the formal process that occurs by the Board of Supervisors for the purpose of construction or improvement of a public road per Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.) §28-6701, 6702, and 6703. Upon establishment, County funds may be expended for the improvement of the public road. Establishment is a statutory requirement prior to expending County funds for the improvement or construction of a public road.

- E. **PUBLIC ROADWAYS:** The entire width of property held for any road under the exclusive control of the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors, whether held by deed, easement, dedication or other claim of right, including bridges.
- F. **ROUTINE MAINTENANCE:** The process of patching asphalt, blading, and shaping shoulders, blading dirt roads, placing plating material (under 250 cubic yards), mowing weeds, cleaning ditches, sweeping road surfaces, placing traffic control devices, and other similar type activities.

#### 4. **ROAD INVENTORY**

The Public Works Director shall prepare and maintain an official road inventory, which lists all roads in the County Road System, identifies the roads approved for maintenance, and the level and priority of maintenance. The official road inventory shall be reviewed and updated each year.

#### 5. **HIGHWAY/ROAD CLASSIFICATION:**

CLASS I: Roads that have been constructed to prevailing County standards, have accepted rights-of-way, and are maintained by Yavapai County.

CLASS II: Roads that have been formally established as County highways/roads by the Board of Supervisors.

CLASS III: Roads that have been maintained by Yavapai County prior to June 13, 1975 and may or may not have recorded rights-of-way. Upon recommendation of the Public Works Director, the Board of Supervisors may designate these roads as primitive. The County may discontinue maintenance of primitive roads at any time.

CLASS IV: Roads crossing lands controlled by or owned by other governmental agencies. These roads may be maintained in accordance with an Intergovernmental Agreement, Memorandum of Understanding or other appropriate formal document approved by the Board of Supervisors.

CLASS V: Roads that have not been maintained in any manner, but are public roads.

#### 6. **RIGHT-OF- WAY ACQUISITION**

County resources may be used to obtain title for right-of-way necessary for approved projects. No construction shall commence prior to right-of-way acquisition. All right-of-way projects must be approved by the Board of Supervisors.



**B. PUBLIC ROAD MAINTENANCE**

**1. MAINTENANCE**

The County is allowed by State law (A.R.S. §28-6705) to maintain the roads that meet Class I, Class II, Class III and Class IV. Maintenance of unpaved roads includes grading and limited application of rock products to preserve the status quo, but shall not include the use of cement or petroleum products unless approved by the Public Works Director. Paved roads may be seal coated and patched, but may not be overlaid or re-constructed unless established as County highways.

**2. CRITERIA FOR PRIORITY ROAD MAINTENANCE**

The County intends to maintain public roads that were built to the prevailing County standards, or that have sufficient documentation indicating they were formally approved for maintenance. These roads will have priority for maintenance over all other roads in the County Road System. This priority will be recommended by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors.

**3. GRADING STANDARD FOR UNPAVED ROADS**

Grading frequency shall be determined by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors. The road grading frequency may be modified by the Public Works Director.

**4. GRAVEL SURFACING**

Gravel surfacing may be placed on roads approved for maintenance to improve the drivability, safety conditions and to reduce long term maintenance costs as directed by the Public Works Director, that involves the use of less than 250 cubic yards of material. Work that requires more than 250 cubic yards will be a project that will need Board of Supervisors’ approval.

**5. DRAINAGE**

Roadway pipe culverts may be placed within roads approved for maintenance to facilitate drainage, improve drainage conditions and reduce hazards. The type, size and location shall be approved by the Public Works Director in cooperation with the Flood Control District.

Drainage swales may be placed across roadways and may be marked and signed. The type, location and size of all drainage swales shall be approved by the Public Works Director.

**6. DISCONTINUANCE OF ROAD MAINTENANCE**

The Board of Supervisors has the right to discontinue or reduce maintenance on any County maintained road as recommended by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors.

The County shall not maintain any road that is not formally approved for maintenance by the Board of Supervisors.

## **7. ROAD SAFETY**

The Public Works Director shall determine whether a road is safe for County equipment operators to do routine maintenance. The Public Works Director shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors the removal of any roads from the approved for maintenance status if it is unsafe for County equipment operators to do routine maintenance.

## **8. ADDITION OF NEW ROADS FOR MAINTENANCE**

New roads may be added to the official road inventory if established and constructed to current County standards, recommended for approval by the Public Works Director and approved for maintenance by the Board of Supervisors.

## **9. SNOWPLOWING**

Snowplowing on all County roads shall be done in accordance with the following priority:

## **10. CHIP SEAL MAINTENANCE**

Chip sealing, as a maintenance activity, may be applied to previously asphalted roads. Priority shall be given to roads where a lack of chip seal will result in severe deterioration of the road surface or upon the recommendation of the Public Works Director. A pavement management system, when available, shall be utilized to assist in determining priority.

# **C. PUBLIC ROAD CONSTRUCTION**

## **1. NEW ROAD CONSTRUCTION**

All new public roads shall be constructed as required by Resolution 1036. The Public Works Director may request waivers of certain requirements, which may be approved by the Board of Supervisors.

All engineering and roadwork will be reviewed on a regular basis to determine the most cost efficient method of providing the services (i.e. in-house; outside contracts).

## **2. UPGRADES AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING ROADS**

The Board of Supervisors may upgrade an existing public road provided the road is an established County Highway. The following procedures may be used to upgrade or improve roads:

- A. **County Projects:** Road projects shall be recommended by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors. The Public Works Director shall include reasons why the upgrade is needed. Funding and other resources shall be taken into consideration when determining project priority.
- B. **Improvement Districts:** An improvement district may be formed through the formal road improvement district process to improve roads. The County may participate cooperatively in

these districts with money, engineering, material, equipment or labor if the road is established as a County highway. The Board of Supervisors shall determine the type and extent of all participation.

### **3. PETITIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENTS**

Establishment of a road as a County Highway shall be in accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes §28-6701, 6702, and 6703.

No road shall be established unless it is on the approved five-year capital road plan.

### **4. DOUBLE CHIP SEAL**

Placement of a bituminous penetration and double chip seal on any existing County unpaved road shall be recommended by the Public Works Director and then approved by the Board of Supervisors. These projects shall have the proper base and drainage as determined by the Public Works Director. To qualify, the road must be an established County highway.

A yearly chip sealing program shall be prepared by the Public Works Director and presented to the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors for approval. Roads may be recommended to be added or deleted to this program list and approved by the Board of Supervisors. This type and method of chip seal shall be approved by the Public Works Director. Asphalt millings may be used in lieu of double chip seal if approved by the Public Works Director.

### **5. ASPHALTIC CONCRETE (OVERLAYS)**

Hot mix or cold mix overlays may be placed on County roads that are established County highways.

All overlays shall be approved by the Public Works Director prior to placement. Location, mix design and depth shall be determined by the Public Works Director.

### **6. PROJECT SCHEDULE LIST**

The Public Works Director will prepare a yearly list of major road projects (projects that are not routine maintenance), and submit the list to the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors for approval during the annual budget preparation and no later than May 1 of each year.

## **D. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

### **1. BLUE STAKE**

Blue Stake shall be notified prior to any road excavation or placement of signposts.

### **2. CATTLE GUARDS**

Cattle guards may be placed on County roads if approved by the Public Works Director and the Board of Supervisors pursuant to A.R.S. §28-6710. Cattle guards shall be a standard metal type or other approved material with appropriate openings under the structure. Upon installation and construction of a cattleguard on a County road, the County shall maintain and repair the cattleguard.

### **3. EMERGENCIES**

The Public Works Director may authorize emergency repairs to roads and drainage structures approved for maintenance when there is unanticipated damage by storm or other events. The Public Works Director will regularly report all major emergency repair costs to the Yavapai County Board of Supervisors.

### **4. FENCING**

The County has no legal obligation to fence rights-of-way. Requests for fencing of roadways will be considered on an individual county needs basis as recommended by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors.

### **5. PUBLIC ROADS CROSSING FEDERAL LANDS**

All work on roads through Federal lands shall conform to any approved Memorandum of Understanding or Federal regulations.

### **6. PRIMITIVE ROADS**

Primitive roads may be designated by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to A.R.S. §28-6706, after receiving a recommendation from the Public Works Director. Signs denoting a primitive road will be placed at locations approved by the Public Works Director and the County Attorney's office.

### **7. REQUEST FOR SERVICE**

Requests for service shall be properly documented and shall receive a priority for investigation and action. The party initiating the request should be informed of the status of the request. If the service request cannot be performed then the employee's supervisor (or designee) in charge shall promptly notify the requesting party of the situation and explain why the request cannot be performed.

### **8. ROAD MILE MARKERS**

Road mile markers may be placed on public roads if recommended by the Public Works Director.

### **9. ROADWAY STRIPING**

Roadway striping may be applied to main public roads and to other public roads where a special need has been demonstrated. All striping shall be approved by the Public Works Director. Permanent striping will not be applied to any road which is scheduled to receive a resurfacing within three months. Roads to be resurfaced may be temporarily striped for safety.

### **10. TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES**

All regulatory, warning and street signs within the right-of-way will meet the intent of Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The Public Works Director will be responsible for interpretation and enforcement.

Special information or direction signs may be permitted, provided they are approved by the Public Works Director. The initial cost of the sign (material and installation) will be paid by the person requesting and

the County may assume the maintenance cost. Temporary real estate directional or information signs may be placed on County roads and will be promptly removed when no longer needed by the party placing the sign(s). These signs must not create any hazard or nuisance and will be removed or relocated if directed by the Public Works Director.

All requests for special, permanent type signs and structures shall be reviewed by the Planning and Building Department and the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors. Public liability insurance shall be retained by the requestor for the life of the structure and naming Yavapai County as an additional insured. Upon termination of the insurance, the structure shall be removed by the permittee.

The Public Works Director may recommend placement of signs marking the beginning and/or end of County road maintenance.

#### **11. BICYCLE SIGN PROVISION**

The Public Works Department will review requests for bicycle signage on right of ways/roadways under County jurisdiction provided the following elements apply:

1. The approved signs are restricted to Bicycle Sign W11-1\* and the Share the Road Sign W16-1P\*, and must be used together in accordance with Section 2C.60 and Section 2C.49 of the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (M.U.T.C.D.).
2. Sign materials and placement complies with all standards and regulations outlined in the latest edition of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (M.U.T.C.D.).
3. Said Bicycle Sign placement is restricted only to regionally significant or collector roads/right of ways recommended by the Public Works Director and approved by the Board of Supervisors.
4. Sign requests will be reviewed by the Public Works Department on an individual case by case basis with approval authority at the sole discretion of the Public Works Director.
5. The Yavapai County Public Works Director reserves the right to rescind the approval for placed signs and authorize the relocation or complete removal of the signs for public safety.

#### **12. SPECIAL PAVEMENT MARKING**

Requests for special pavement markings will be reviewed by the Public Works Director who will make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors for action.

#### **13. TREES**

Trees within public roadways may be removed by the County if the trees are infected or create a hazard or potential hazard to the traveling public. Other tree removal may be approved by the Public Works Director.

#### **14. NON-ROAD RELATED ACTIVITIES**

The Public Works Department can expend funds, labor, equipment and material on activities not related to public roads provided each activity has been authorized in writing by the Public Works Director,

approved by the Board of Supervisors, and provided all costs are funded from an approved non-road fund source. Road Funds cannot be used for non-road activities which are not related to public roads.

15. **VARIANCES**

Requests for variances to adopted policy may be submitted to the Public Works Director who shall review all requests and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors who will make the final determination.

16. **WATER FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE**

Water used for maintenance and construction shall be obtained from approved and authorized sources.

**E. PENALTY**

Any employee who violates this ordinance is subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.

## **F. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance repeals Ordinance 2005-1 and any portion of any resolution, rule or regulation conflicting with this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall be effective April 15, 2013
